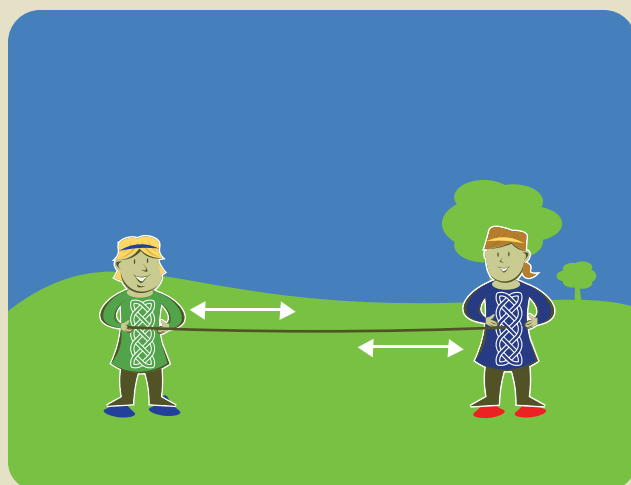
CHALLENGE 16 ESCAPE

CHALLENGE 17 HOOP RACE

Then number 3 jumps onto the hoop placed in front and then number 2 jumps to number 3's hoop then picks up hoop behind and passes it forward and continues until the team pass the line.

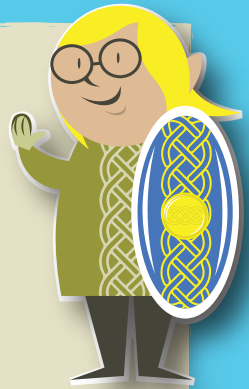


FIONN THE LEADER

Another way of sending a message is through song. There is a very important message in the Irish anthem Amhrán na bhFiann. Can you learn the song in Irish?



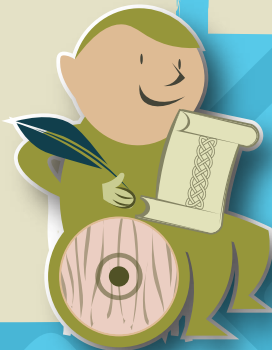
SINEAD THE MAKER
